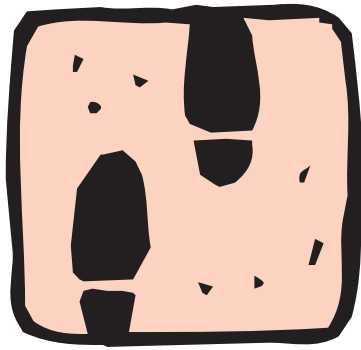
August 24 : One Unitarian's View: Advancing Human Rights in Hong Kong - Summer 2014
