Dec. 6: “Manifesto For a Christian Nation”

The Christian tradition decided to create an official version of the teachings of Christ at the time of the Nicene creed, but what we don’t often discuss is how many alternate versions were suppressed in order to create this orthodoxy. In contrast, the Nyingmapa Buddhists of Tibet created a unique method of teaching called “treasure revelation”, by which they could continually update the teachings of the “orthodox” Buddhist cannon to fit the times.

What would have happened had Judeo-Christian traditions continued to roll with the advances of the times? What type of spiritual traditions can be created with an “open cannon” that allows orthodoxy to mold and shift according to the needs of the people. Find out more this Sunday!

To help us move toward becoming a Welcoming Congregation Fa Jun will include it in some of his sermons, there will be a Fellowship discussion about it after the holiday season, and we may have a guest speaker, maybe someone from PFLAG.

As you may have noticed, we are experimenting, until December, with taking a break from Time for All Ages. This will give more time for adult discussion and for children's lesson plans.

Board voted to hire Pavco to resurface our driveway, using our unrestricted endowment funds. Delay will lead to further deterioration and higher cost in the future. We can do some maintenance ourselves digging out and filling cracks, to extend the lifetime of the new surface.
