Winter Survival Sack Drive Sun, 2/3-2/17 In week two of a three-week drive, we continue to collect personal hygiene items, socks, and underwear for "survival sacks" and for smaller "hygiene kits" that Sacred Heart Community Service distributes to its homeless clients. Students in our RE classes will pack them on Sunday, 2/24. The survival sacks are backpacks containing 3 months of supplies; Sacred Heart distributes about 100 of these each month. Because underwear and socks are included, "men's" and "women's" sacks are packed. The "hygiene kits" are small bags of hygiene items that are available at Sacred Heart on an ongoing basis to those in need. Items for these kits should be small travel or hotel amenity size in order to fit into a gallon-sized ziplock bag. **For the items to donate, look in February's Fellowship News or small handouts in the foyer.** Cash and check donations are also welcome, and will be used to purchase any items in short supply. Write checks to UUFLG, with "survival sacks" in the memo line. We hope to fill 15 backpacks and 15 hygiene kits on 2/24!
