#### August Board Update

Greetings, beloved community! Here is an update on some of the items from the board's agenda this summer.

A new, highly adjustable LED lighting system has been installed in the chancel, with our new tenant Unity Spiritual Center contributing to the cost.

Those who voted among the five shade cloth color samples exhibited at the social hour on August 11 gave green a resounding victory. (The total number of votes was more than 50% of the number of UUFLG members.) The board concurs that green will be an excellent choice for our new deck awning, and Rick Roberts is scheduling the installation.

To make the facility priorities list developed by the Stewardship Committee more readily accessible, the board will be posting it on Google Drive and circulating it via the UUFLG discussion group. The list is an ever-evolving document, with Stewardship meeting regularly to assess new needs, job completions, fund availability, and other factors. The board is delighted to report that Albert James, who already does so much for our community, has also agreed to serve as our custodian. Please welcome him in this new role.

UUFLG recently received a generous bequest from the estate of former longtime member Charles A. Walton. The money will be allocated between a building fund and an endowment fund for our long-term financial health.

In its biannual review of our Personal Safety Policy, the board adopted revisions that delete the language specific to children and youth, instead, referencing the separate Safe Church Policy adopted in June. Both policies are available on our <u>website</u> (Administration/Administration and Governance/Policies).

RE is continuing under its new distributed-leadership model. Two of our highly competent teenagers will be stepping up as preschool/nursery aides, with Arthur moving into a new role as the assistant elementary teacher.

Finally, there is still room at the board's September 21 pasta feed and mac-'n'-cheese-off. This is both a fundraiser and a fun-raiser! There is a signup sheet in the foyer for anyone who would like to join us.
