#### **June 7: “Gurus, Governments, and the Dangerous Dance of Trust”**

This Sunday will explore the nuances of these relationships, and perhaps find out that things are not quite so “Black & White” as they seem.

#### **June 14: ““Masculine” Virtues for the Modern World”**

In the modern world, the line between masculinity and femininity is blurred. We have found that many of the traditional roles for men and women have been arbitrarily assigned by cultural voices. We have freed ourselves from being stuck in roles determined by our physical gender.

#### **June 28: “Thresholds on the Summer Solstice and Age of Aquarius”**

At the Summer Solstice, the Sun reaches its highest position in the sky and the hottest days of the summer are still ahead. Mother Earth is heavy with the bounty of the autumnal harvest and the Father, the Sun, is with her.

While we revel in the hot days of summer, our sub-conscious is aware we are poised on a threshold. On a greater scale in our Earth's history, we are leaving an Age of secrets, mystery and confusion to one of purification of our inner spirit and outer physical selves; it is time to honor the elements that have been here much longer than you and me. ## June Theme: The Father

During the time of the summer solstice, many ancient people felt naturally called to honor the solar principle, identified with the “sky father” or the sun.

Like the sun or the sky father of old, we may relate to our own fathers as something bright and nourishing, or something far-off and aloof. Some of us grew up in religious traditions that worship a god who lives in the sky - and doesn't seem to have much to do with this world except to deliver expectations and punishment from time to time.

Our world, it seems, may be out of touch with it's healthy masculine. We have the power to protect each other, yet still we go to war. We have the power to think of new systems, to go on our warrior's quest, but we often reinforce old ways that continue to harm some communities, while benefitting others.

This month we'll take a look into the masculine brain. For all that it is hierarchical, testosterone influenced, not as connection oriented as the feminine brain, it is beautiful. We will work to look with loving eyes on this father within us, so that we can bring those masculine values out into the light of the summer sun, and shine to those around us who need our care.
