A Gift to the Hard of Hearing

Our own Santa Claus, Alan Martin, has installed a wire loop around the Sanctuary and hooked it up to the sound system.

This means that those who have hearing aids with an active tele-coil can receive speech from speakers using one of our microphones directly into their hearing aid. This provides much clearer and understandable speech than hearing just the sound waves in the air.

Irving Yabroff reports that he is able, using the tele-coil in his hearing aid, to understand speech spoken into a microphone in the Sunday services, making the services much more meaningful and enjoyable to him.

So, if you are wearing a hearing aid, check with your provider to be sure it contains a tele-coil and that it is enabled. Most modern hearing aids do have this feature which can enhance telephone conversations as well, if the phone you are using has a similar coil in it.
