
Beginning Sunday, November 30th, through December 14st, the following items may be left in the collection box:

All canned goods, especially meals in a can such as stew, chili, soup, and tuna; peanut butter in a plastic jar, canned foods with pop tops, 100% fruit juice, low-sugar single serving boxed cereal, canned fruit in its own juice with no sugar added, and low salt canned vegetables. Please do not bring anything packaged in glass, or bulk quantities of rice, flour or sugar.

If you prefer to give a monetary gift, that would be very welcome. One dollar translates into 1.3 pounds of food. A check should be made out to UUFLG with Second Harvest Food Bank in the memo line and placed in the envelope within the collection box, or handed to Jim Beebe, Coralee Linton, or Ellen Hill.


