### Apr. 7 - "How to Be a Fool for Love!"

It has been said that only fools fall in love, while at other times we see that love is the wisest possible choice. But to truly love, we have to overcome the need to be right, and to tear down the walls that put "my" perspective before yours. When we can surrender some of our armor, we can learn to be vulnerable and true sharing can begin, bringing us out of spite, cognitive dissonance, and the distance that may divide us. ## Apr. 14 – "How the Buddha Was Right, and Wrong"

Our speaker this morning has preached at Los Gatos many times, sometimes drawing on the insights of Gautama, the Buddha. But despite his appreciation of Buddhism, Chris feels that some of its teachings might be questioned, especially when radically applied. To celebrate and reflect upon Buddhist doctrine, he will contrast Gautama's words with the poetry of a famous English author. Which teachings serve us best, those of the ancient Indian prophet or those of the poet?

Rev. Dr. Chris Schriner is Minister Emeritus of Mission Peak Unitarian Universalist Congregation in Fremont. He is also a retired psychotherapist and a scholar in philosophy of mind. One of his six books, *Feel Better Now*, was strongly influenced by Buddhism.








### Super Successful Survival Sack Drive at UUFLG

This year UUFLG congregants contributed record amounts of supplies, cash, and check donations to our Survival Sack for the Homeless Drive. As a result, our Religious Exploration students were able to pack 25 backpacks – 10 more than last year – and 18 hygiene bags, which were delivered to Sacred Heart Community Service on Feb. 25, in time for its survival sack distribution in early March. Thanks to all who contributed, and to our RE students, who worked in pairs to pack the sacks carefully and efficiently.

Kristi Iverson, who represents the UU Church of Palo Alto on the Steering Committee of MVPJ, reached out to UUFLG about this opportunity. MVPJ identified UUFLG as a congregation that has a commitment to peace and justice and that has participated in some of MVPJ's events in the recent past.

Here's how MVPJ envisions involvement such as ours:

MVPJ, as a multifaith organization, is intrinsically diverse. Coming from different faiths and spiritual traditions, we will not all agree on everything! In response to a concern about justice or peace, some will feel called to pray, some to study, some to speak, some to act. Our programs and activities have ranged from prayer gatherings to protests, from meeting with elected officials to making public statements, from studies, panels and teach-ins to visible actions of solidarity. Some members have been called to engage in peaceful civil disobedience. We encourage "participating" congregations, organizations and individuals to participate when these programs align with their own values and sense of call, understanding and respecting that not all of our programs feel appropriate for everyone. We celebrate that diversity and learn from it how to live together in peace with justice, even when we disagree. Our programs and statements are offered only on behalf of our steering committee, and do not pretend to represent consensus from the rich, beautiful array of religious and spiritual traditions who join us in the larger, sacred journey of seeking peace and justice.

Our congregation's formal participation is an invitation to continue, and to even expand, our advocacy of peace and justice through a local multifaith coalition, living our shared values and principles!
