The Mother

May 5 - "In Praise of the Great Mother"

More and more, our world is becoming "trauma-informed" as to how healing these wounds of the mind and heart can untangle the knots of our most toxic and painful patterns, both personally and socially. —Rev. A state law requires that all our employees complete sexual harassment prevention training by January 1, 2020. Our insurance company offers this training online, and we will be requesting our employees to complete it.
