Winter Survival Sack Drive for Homeless

This month, we are collecting donations and supplies for the survival sacks and smaller hygiene bags that Sacred Heart Community Service distributes to the homeless. Since our building is closed and gatherings are limited, our drive is taking a different form with three ways to participate:

1. Request* an empty backpack, pack it with supplies at home, and return it to the Fellowship on Saturday, Feb. 27, 2-5p or request pickup (Santa Clara Valley area only).
2. Purchase any of the items on the supply list and drop them off at the Fellowship on Feb. 27, 2-5p.
3. Mail a monetary donation to UUFLG by Feb. 27 with "survival sacks" in the memo line.

Survival Sacks

Survival sacks are backpacks with three months of supplies. Sacred Heart distributes about 100 of these each month. Because underwear and socks are included, there are sacks for men and women. Items needed for one sack are:

- 1 rain poncho
- 1 small blanket
- 2 pairs of underwear (most needed: men's L and XL)
- 2 pairs of socks (for men or women)
- 1 small first aid kit
- 1 washcloth
- 1 bar of soap (3 oz.)
- 1 toothbrush
- 1 full-size tube of toothpaste
- 1 deodorant (3.5 oz. size)
- 1 bottle of shampoo
- 1 comb
- 1 razor
- 2 rolls of toilet paper



Hygiene Kits

Hygiene kits are small bags of hygiene items that are available at Sacred Heart ongoing. All items for these kits should be travel or hotel amenity size to fit in a gallon-sized ziplock bag. Items needed for one kit are:

- toothbrush
- toothpaste
- shampoo
- conditioner
- body wash and/or soap
- comb
- deodorant
- hand lotion
- razor
- tissue pack
- mouthwash
- washcloth
