
Week 2 of 3: UUFLG Drive for Second Harvest Food Bank

Due to the lingering effect of Covid closures and the high cost of rent in Silicon Valley, Second Harvest is now distributing food to 80 percent more people than before the pandemic. To meet this huge demand, Second Harvest has had to drop its well-known, but very labor intensive, food barrel program and purchase food in bulk to provide balanced meals to a much larger number of people.

UUFLG continues to collect monetary donations for Second Harvest. Place cash and checks in the collection jar in the Fellowship foyer or hand donations to a Social

Action team member. Mailing checks to the Fellowship is also an option. Please write checks to UUFLG with Second Harvest in the memo line.

Covid Safety Remains a Priority

We continue to reassess our recommendations to keep everyone as safe as possible at UUFLG. One way to do this is to wear masks whenever indoors. Another way is to not sing indoors. Singing outdoors is allowed with masks and at least six feet apart. Finally, to circulate fresh air in the sanctuary, we recommend keeping open the two sets of outside doors and the hallway doors with the HVAC system running cool or warm air, depending on the weather.
